Exceptional Dialysis Runs

Background:

Exceptional dialysis runs occur when a dialysis run is missed or there are complications resulting in multiple machine to complete a patient's dialysis run. Missed dialysis runs occur when a patient is *not present* and may or may not result in a wasted machine set-up. Complicated dialysis runs occur when a patient *is present* and one or more additional machine set-ups are required.

Our clients would like to be able to capture the reason for missed dialysis runs and track machine set-ups for resource planning purposes and to identify changes in scheduled dialysis treatments.


Navigation:

PROMIS 4 > Dialysis Schedule > Actual Schedule > Manage

Functionality:

Exceptional dialysis runs are captured in the *Actual Schedule*. Fields displayed in the pop-up depend on whether the patient is present (i.e. a complicated run) or not (i.e. missed run).

In a complicated dialysis run, the patient is set-up for dialysis but **no dialysate** runs through the machine resulting in a machine set-up(s) to be aborted.

In a missed dialysis run, the patient is not present and the machine set-up may or may not be used for another patient.
