

Modality Selection Cheat Sheet

Background:


Modality Selection is a process in which a patient discusses suitable treatment options with their healthcare provider. In this process, the patient is assessed for their suitability for different treatment options, their suitability for transplant and are educated on the treatment options as well.

Navigation:

PROMIS 4 > Patient Overview > Renal > Modality Selection

Functionality:

- Under *Treatment Options*, if a patient is not suitable for independent therapies, select *No* and highlight the reason for unsuitability from the *Reason for Independent Therapy Unsuitability* drop-down list. The options available are:

- Significant cognitive impairment and no dialysis support person (brain damage, dementia)
- Significant mental health barrier and no dialysis support person (psychiatric condition, active substance use disorder excluding: alcohol, marijuana, prescribed narcotics)
- Unsuitable home conditions and lack of facility-based independent dialysis (unhoused, no space for supplies)

- In the *Reason* dropdown for the *Potential Candidate for Transplant* field, the options available are shown in the following image:

- For unsuitability related to Home Hemodialysis in particular, select *No* in the *HD Home* row in the *Treatment Options* table and select a reason from the *Medical Reason for Not Suitable* drop-down:

Impact of *Status* on the eGFR Report:

- The columns of ***Transplant Education Provided*** and ***Modality Orientation Provided*** on the eGFR Priority report will show information from the Education table in Modality Selection.
- The status of the most recent education/discussion record will show on these columns of the report as ***Y*** for ***Provided to Patient***, ***R*** as ***Patient Refused*** or ***N*** if ***no records*** are captured.

In case there are two education/discussion records with the same date, the following table depicts what will show on these columns of the eGFR report:

Status of both records	Status on Tx Education & Modality Orientation Columns on eGFR Report
If both records = <i>Patient Refused</i>	R
If both records = <i>Provided to Patient</i>	Y
If one record = <i>Provided to Patient</i> and the other record = <i>Patient Refused</i>	Y

Impact of *Status* on the KY Transplant Readiness Report:

- The column of ***Transplant Education Provided*** on the Kidney Transplant Readiness report gets information from the Education table on the Modality selection module.
- The values on the column appear as ***Y*** for ***Provided to Patient***, ***R*** as ***Patient Refused*** or ***N*** if ***no records*** are captured.
- This report does not look at dates when populating data on the Transplant Education Provided column.

Status of records in Modality Selection	Value in the Transplant Education Provided column
If at least one transplant related education has been captured.	Y



If all education/discussion records = Patient Refused	R
If there are no transplant related education provided.	N
